BACKGROUND

INTERNATIONAL PHARMACEUTICAL STUDENTS FEDERATION (IPSF)

The International Pharmaceutical Students Federation (IPSF) is the leading international advocacy organization for pharmacy students. It was formed in 1949 and currently represents approximately 350,000 pharmacy students and young graduates from over 84 countries worldwide, with its headquarters in The Netherlands.

IPSF plans and executes a wide variety of activities through its 5 regional offices i.e. Asia Pacific, Africa, Eastern Mediterranean, Europe and Pan America.

AFRICAN PHARMACEUTICAL SYMPOSIUM (AFPS)

The African Pharmaceutical Symposium is an Annual event organized by the IPSF- African Regional Office. It brings together pharmacy students and recent graduates from all over Africa, in African city for about a week! The delegates engage in educational and scientific symposia, workshops, industrial visits, public health campaigns, excursions around the host city, and a great variety of socio-cultural events.

In 2016, the 5th African Pharmaceutical Symposium (AfPS) will be held in Mombasa- Kenya, hosted by Kenya's Pharmacy Students Association, KEPhSA1

KEPhSA represents about 1000 students from six universities in Kenya, and acts as the link between the students and professional bodies such as the Pharmaceutical Society of Kenya (PSK), with which it is affiliated.

As a student-led association, KEPhSA aims at promoting cohesion among its member chapters, who together take part in professional development activities, community service as well as team building and fun events that bring all its members together.

.Structure of the Symposium

We plan to have a 3-part symposium as follows:

a) Pre-symposium event- Leaders Training will be held in Kenyatta University Conference Center. It will be aimed at equipping the students who are the future workforce with leadership and management skills required to take on global roles on health issues, pharmacy and engage in policy making.



b) Main symposium – This will be held in Mombasa. We will have key-note speeches, workshops, an industrial visit, patient counseling competition, compounding event, clinical skills examination, and a public health campaign aimed at the need of the Mombasa community. During one of the afternoons, attendees will be taken for an excursion to Fort Jesus, Kilindini harbour and other tourist attraction sites within the city.

c) Post symposium tour- Delegates will have an opportunity to tour different parts of our beautiful country and experience the rich Kenyan heritage.

PROFESSIONAL ACTIVITIES...

PATIENT COUNSELLING AND CLINICAL SKILLS EVENT

The Patient Counseling Event demonstrates and promotes the importance of communication skills in drug therapy and disease management. Clinical Skills Event is designed to test and develop pharmaceutical knowledge as well as problem solving, verbal and written communication, and clinical skills. These events will be conducted in fun and competitive environments to help furnish participants with professional skills.



PUBLIC HEALTH CAMPAIGN

On one of the afternoons, the students will carry out a Public Health campaign e.g. Diabetes awareness, Anti-Tuberculosis campaign etc, to impact the community where the symposium will be held.



REGIONAL ASSEMBLY.

The Regional Assembly (RA) is primary decision making body of the IPSF Regional Office and consists of the official delegates of IPSF-AFRO member countries and the IPSF Regional Working Group. The RA meets annually (usually during the annual symposia) to discuss all ongoing matters and plans of the Region, to accept reports and to elect a new Regional Working Group. As a member of IPSF, you will have the opportunity to transpose the policies and working rules of the board through your ideas. The RA is chaired by IPSF AfRO Chairperson.



Voting rights. Countries which maintain the Full Membership are allowed to vote during the RA. The Official Delegates must present the Credential Form to the IPSF AfRO Secretary General prior the first RA. Members in Association and Individual Members do not have a voting right but are strongly welcomed to participate in discussions.

...We'll also have keynote speeches and workshops based on the theme. We encourage delegates to participate in the poster exhibition competition that will also take place during the symposium. In due time, we'll have a call for abstracts.

VISA REQUIREMENTS

Valid passports or other travel documents acceptable to the Government of Kenya are required for all persons wishing to enter Kenya;

- ~ Passports must be valid for at least Six (6)
 Months.
- ~ Passports must have a clean and a full visa page for endorsement.

Nationals of the following countries do not require visas to enter Kenya.

Uganda, Ghana, Sierra Leone, Zambia,
Botswana, Mauritius, Namibia, Tanzania,
Burundi, Lesotho, Papua, New Guinea,
Malawi, Rwanda, Zimbabwe.


